RULES AND REGULATIONS OF THE BOY SCOUTS OF AMERICA

Article X, Section 6 — Silver Antelope Award

- Clause 2. The Boy Scouts of America, acting through the National Court of Honor, may award the Silver Antelope for distinguished service to youth upon the following basis and procedure:
- (a) This award may be made each year upon the nomination of the regional cabinet. The nomination shall be submitted not less than thirty days in advance of the date upon which it is desired to present the award.
- (b) This award may be made for noteworthy service of exceptional character to youth by registered Scouters, Cub Scouters, Varsity Scouters, and Explorer leaders within the territory under the jurisdiction of a regional cabinet.
- (c) As evidence of the award there shall be presented: a suitable certificate, duly authenticated by the Boy Scouts of America, pursuant to the action of the National Court of Honor; and a miniature Silver Antelope suspended by an orange, white, and orange ribbon to be worn around the neck.

- (d) It shall be a general policy that no public announcements shall be made by the region in advance of action of the National Court of Honor with reference to the names presented for consideration.
- (e) These awards shall be presented to the recipients by the region in connection with its annual meeting or other public function, but only after approval of the award by the National Court of Honor.
- (f) Each region shall be entitled to one nomination for each thirty thousand registered adults or portion thereof in its territory, as of December 31 preceding the nominations, according to the records of the national office.
- (g) Regions not using their full allotment in any year may accumulate the unused portion for use in any subsequent year.
- (h) The National Court of Honor may, based upon initial recommendation of the Operations Group, award the Silver Antelope to persons in overseas areas.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION FOR THE REGION IN THE FINAL PROCESS OF THIS NOMINATION

- The region may order Silver Antelope supplies directly from the National Distribution Center. A special form, No. 92-106 is available from the National Court of Honor.
- Long established policy limits the award on the Silver Antelope to adults over 21 who are registered as volunteer Scouters. Nominations may not be made for posthumous awards.
- 3. Nominations will not be considered for former professional Scouters or council employees within 5 years of their leaving employment with

- BSA (i.e., any form of employment such as secretary, ranger, camp staff member, or professional-technical position, or any form of temporary or full-time employment.)
- 4. This nomination form must be sent to the national office, c/o National Court of Honor (SUM 212) at least 30 days before the award is to be presented. The nomination form will be processed and the certificate printed with appropriate signatures.
- 5. The region will be billed for printing and processing the Silver Antelope certificates.
